What is the admission process?

For most people who wish to study abroad, the admissions process can be one of the most challenging procedures that they face. It normally involves filling out basic information along with your academic transcripts, writing a statement of purpose (SOP) and reporting your GRE° Test and/or TOEFL° IBT scores. Additionally letters of recommendation from your teachers (if you are a student) or supervisors (if you are a working professional) are required. The admissions committee mainly bases its decision on your GRE° Test and TOEFL° IBT score and academic performance with the other paraphernalia carrying some significance.

The test pattern

The GRE® Test is spread over three broad areas:

Analytical Writing (AW): Consists of two topics: Issue & Argument. The two topics are followed by a question each and the test taker is asked to respond specifically to the question. The time limit for both the topics is 30 mins. There is no choice of topics given with the Issue and Argument topic.

Verbal Reasoning (VR) (2 sections): There are 2 VR sections with 20 questions each and a time limit of 30 mins for each section. Antonyms and analogies questions have been removed from the test, so there are no questions that test vocabulary out of context. Sentence completion questions have been replaced by Text Completion questions, with the inclusion of a new type of question called Sentence Equivalence question.

Quantitative Reasoning (QR) (2 sections): There are two QR sections of 20 questions each with a time limit of 35 mins for each section. There is increased emphasis on data interpretation and real-life scenarios. An on-screen calculator for use in this section reduces the emphasis on computation.
